Session 3

This week is a fun one.

Today we would like you to create the canvas that you will be creating your art work on next week.

You are going to be choosing one of your sketches from last week and recreating that with some more stone age materials- however first your creature needs a background to stand on.

You will need:

A piece of paper

Some soil dry and damp

Leaves or grass

Pestle and mortar or stones



Firstly, think about the scene you want to create, where would you like the green and the brown parts of your scenery.

Next mix your soil with a little bit of water to create a paste. You don't want it too thick as it will be difficult to use and too thin and it will run off the page.

Then use it to paint a landscape on your page. Try not to cover your page completely or it will be difficult to create texture using the green- see the example above.

After this, fetch your leaves the greener and bigger the better.

Get a grown up to help you- Crush and rip the leaves with a small amount of boiling water. This will release the green pigment (chlorophyll) and begin to make a watery green colour.

You can then use this to add some depth and detail to you picture. See the example of the tree above.

Enjoy and have fun experiment with the different pigments and try not to get too messy. \odot
